RMHC[®] Atlantic helps families with sick children stay together and near the medical care they need. Our programs include Ronald McDonald House[®], a "home-away-from-home" for outof-town families with sick children and two Ronald McDonald Family Rooms—in Halifax and Moncton—which provide an oasis of calm and support right inside the hospital.

Families from New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, and Nova Scotia with sick or seriously injured children often need to travel to the IWK Health Centre in Halifax for treatment. The travel distance, costs (hotel, food, parking, etc.) and additional stresses of an unanticipated trip can be an added burden for families. The Ronald McDonald House provides a safe, comfortable place for families to stay with hot meals and a supportive environment, just minutes from the hospital.

RMHC Atlantic is a non-profit organization. While RMHC was founded—and is generously supported by—McDonald's restaurants, it is an independent charity and depends upon charitable donations and volunteer support from individuals, corporations and foundations to fulfill their mission. They receive no operational funding from government.

RMHC Atlantic Stats

- In our most recent typical year (2019), RMHC Atlantic supported 2,067 families at the Ronald McDonald House in Halifax and our Family Rooms in Halifax and Moncton.
- In 2019, RMHC Atlantic provided 4,195 nights of comfort to families.
- No family is ever turned away due to an inability to pay. For those that can, families are asked to contribute \$11 per night.
- While we only request \$11/night, it costs \$140 per night for a stay at the House. Families' stays are made possible through the support of donors, sponsors, and volunteers.
- Our Ronald McDonald House is located a 5-7 minute walk from the IWK Health Centre.
- RMHC Atlantic runs fundraisers each year to help cover the costs of supporting families in their time of need. The biggest annual fundraiser is the PJ Walk for Kids, which takes place on June 12, 2022 in Charlottetown, Halifax, Moncton, Saint John, Sydney, and virtually for participants from anywhere in the RMHC Atlantic community.
- The PJ Walk For Kids symbolizes the walk that RMHC families make from House to hospital

 often in their pyjamas. You, your school, or your family can all participate in the PJ Walk either at one of our five event locations, or from home!
- RMHC Atlantic is building a brand new Ronald McDonald House in Halifax, with 36 rooms that will support twice as many Maritime families.

Giudes

Pre-Activity Questions/Discussion:

- Has anyone you know ever had to travel for medical treatment?
- What are the benefits of keeping a family close to one another when they have a sick or injured child?
- Think of all the things you and your family need when planning an overnight trip (clothes, toothbrush, food, chargers, toys). Imagine you didn't have time to pack those things, how would it feel to travel without them? How would it feel to have those things provided if you had forgot them?
- How does the Ronald McDonald House make a difference in your community?
- How would it feel if your family had to travel far from your community of support your friends, extended family and neighbours during such a difficult time?

Activity:

Create a news article about RMHC Atlantic! Use your writing or video skills to create a news story that will inform people in your community about the services offered by Ronald McDonald House.

Help your audience understand: What is the Ronald McDonald House? Where is the House located and who does it support? Why are these services important? How can families find more info about RMHC Atlantic? How can your community help support RMHC Atlantic?

PJ Walk For Kids:

Does your school ever hold a pyjama day? Our PJ Walk is a great student engagement activity for your classroom or school that can help foster community support for families in need!

Schools can create a virtual team at <u>pjwalk.ca</u> and create their own PJ Walk in their community. Students can run a peer-led day of awareness and fundraising to promote the PJ Walk that highlights what it symbolizes and who it supports. Students can share their news articles with their classmates or school, create posters, and ask their families and friends to sponsor their PJ Walk in support of those traveling to Halifax for their sick or injured child's hospital care.

Meet the MacNeils!

I truly can't put into words how fortunate my family and I have been to be blessed with the Ronald McDonald House.

My son Grayson has spent the majority of his life going back and forth to hospitals, with regular trips to the IWK Health Centre since he was 6 weeks old.

When it began, he would have a fever, refuse to eat, get sick, and develop a rash that resembled a burn. I took him to the emergency room, thinking it was a reaction to something he had eaten. This was the beginning of a long journey for our family. After repeated infections and bouts of illness, hospital visits, and antibiotics, it was clear that something more severe was happening, and we learned that Grayson had deficiencies affecting his immune system. Depending on the type of infection, the symptoms vary in frequency and severity, but thanks to the IWK's support, he's living a happy, fun-filled life playing with the people he loves—his family and friends!



Throughout, the Ronald McDonald House has been our "home away from home." It's a blessing to be able to keep your family together during a time when we needed it the most. Whenever we'd arrive at the House, we would be greeted with very friendly staff, a comfortable room, and plenty of accommodating amenities. The atmosphere is so warm and welcoming, and the staff genuinely care about each and every child in the House. They always make conversation a priority, and never cease to amaze you with the involvement they have with the children.

Games, activities, painting or helping the staff bake are just a few of Grayson's favourites. Reuniting with friends and seeing the excitement on the children's faces will always be one of my most memorable moments. Having a child receiving any kind of medical treatment creates a lot of fear, stress and worry. The Ronald McDonald House allowed me to focus my energy on Grayson's well-being and nurture him back to health. For that, I'm truly grateful!


